Both Associations provide many educational opportunities which support not only petroleum landmen, but also promotes alternative forms of energy. AAPL recently rolled out its Renewable Energy Certificate Program, which will allow participants to expand and broaden their skills as they pertain to renewable energy sources and earn a certificate for each e-learning module. AAPL's new learning management system, *Landman Learning*, provides the ability to register and immediately access materials for both in-person and webinar courses as well as provides an online discussion board which allows networking and discussion of education topics with other course participants. Both Associations provide development assistance to their members for education programs on an as needed basis.

HAPL and AAPL both contribute to furthering the education of students of Association members in support of their pursuit of higher education. Since 2020, HAPL has given more than \$30,000 in student scholarships and teacher excellence contributions. These awards support AAPL's efforts to provide curriculum guidance and program benefits for students in undergraduate and graduate level energy management and petroleum land management programs at accredited universities. Thus, encouraging an infusion of new talent to the profession. AAPL's Landman Scholarship Trust awards students enrolled in these programs more than \$250,000 in student scholarships annually, assisting in preparing the next generation of energy industry leaders.

HAPL and AAPL serve their members and communities through volunteer time and direct financial contribution, in support of the most vulnerable members of our society. This fiscal year HAPL will support community service organizations, including but not limited to (do I sound like a Landman!), the following:

- Brookwood Community Direct support of this caring residential and work facility for adults with functional
 disabilities with financial contributions, through our volunteer members playing a baseball game with residents and
 providing hot dogs and a magician for added entertainment.
- Cattle Baron's Ball Direct volunteer efforts to help the American Cancer Society in its fight to end cancer.

HAPL and AAPL Governmental Affairs Committees work tirelessly on our behalf tracking legislation, regulatory and judicial information as well as other industry trade Associations initiatives and lobbying on our behalf and our profession. AAPL recently highlighted the U.S. Department of Labor proposed Independent Contractor Rule which, if passed, could impact our industry; and HAPL tracking recent Texas State election results and how our industry might be affected because of those outcomes.
