## AAPL 2022 Landman of the Year Brent Broussard, CPL

Brent Broussard is President of Dudley Land Company in Houston, Texas, He began his career as a landman quite by accident. He initially planned on majoring in nursing but a few semesters of Biology at the University of Louisiana Lafayette quickly changed his mind. While researching other branches of Business offered at the University and knowing that he didn't want to be stuck inside an office all day long, Brent stumbled upon Professional Land and Resource Management.

Brent started as an intern in college for Bradley Broussard Land Services in Lafayette.
