The 2023 – 2024 fiscal year 4th quarter AAPL Board Meeting was held on June 19th, 2024, at the Boston Park Plaza, Boston, Massachusetts. Highlights of the meeting are detailed below:

- I. Annual Meeting:
 - This year's Annual Conference was held in Boston, Massachusetts, June 19 21^{st,} and featured two concurrent education sessions.
 - Keynotes: Horizon Breakfast will feature Sarah Sandberg, V.P. Strategic Initiatives; Trudy Cathy White, Chick-Fil-A Ambassador and Author & Entrepreneur; and Tricia Curtis, President & CEO of PetroNerds.
 - At this year's Annual Meeting there were 564 total registrants and 48 sponsors.

- III. Staff News: Jodi Gallegos has been promoted to AAPL Director of Operations. Le'Ann Callihan has been promoted to AAPL Executive Vice President.
- IV. Government Affairs:
 - Federal/State Legislation: 569 bills, a 29% increase from the March BOD meeting at 441bills and have now
 exceeded the number of bills tracked for all of 2023 at only halfway through the year, and more than double
 the number of bills at this same time last year.
 - Federal/State Regulations: 44
 - Federal/State Judicial Cases: 13
 - Content Totals: In this quarter, provided members with 33 pages of original Governmental Affairs Report content, in addition to the biweekly Bill Tracking Summary spreadsheets containing 70 pages of snap bill summaries and legislature weblinks for all 569 bills.
- V. Membership:

Total AAPL membership is 11,251 as of May 22, 2024, with 9,239 Active members, 1,205 Associate members, 260 Senior Status members, and 493 Student members. Of the members included in this count, 2,319 currently hold CPL status, 1,169 currently hold RPL status, 347 currently hold RL status, and 18 currently hold CPL/ESA status.

VI. NAPE Charities Golf and Pickleball Tournament:

The NAPE Charities Golf Tournament a new annual NAPE Charities Pickleball Tournament will be held October 15th and 16th and will benefit NAPE Expo Charities, which supports our American veterans. All sponsorships and donations are tax deductible. These events will be held in conjunction with the AAPL Women In Energy Institute. Sponsorship are now available. 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VIII. AAPL Treasurer's Report for the period ending March 31, 2024:

<u>Statement of Financial Position</u> – As compared to March 31, 2023, total assets have increased 13.1%. The increase is primarily due to market activity related to the investment account and not drawing down on the investment account for cash flow during the last 12 months. Compared to March 31, 2023. total liabilities increased 29.3%, primarily due to an increase in unearned revenue which includes annual meeting, membership dues, form subscriptions, educational seminars, and advertising revenues.

<u>Statement of Activities</u> - Revenues – (exclusive of investment revenue) compared to March 31, 2023, have increased 48.1%.

- Education income has increased year over year primarily due to increased Educational scholarships due to the Alliance Program and the astounding results from the Inaugural Women In Energy Institute.
- Membership income increased 24.4%, year over year due to an increase in membership dues.
- Certification income increased 86.6%, year over year due to an increase in fees.

• NAPE income increased year over year due to a final NAPE distribution after fiscal year end of the previous year.

Expenses – Compared to March 31, 2023, have decreased 10.3%.

- Publications area has decreased primarily due to a timing and real variance on the printing of the Directory. Publications printed fewer directories than last year.
- Education expenses decreased year over year primarily due to printing costs' being down. General and administrative expenses decreased primarily due to a decrease in staffing and an elimination of profit sharing, resulting in a decrease in salaries and benefits. Other areas of savings include Advertising/Marketing and travel expenses.
- Advocacy expenses decreased year over year due to the cancellation of the Hillco Partners contracted expense from the prior year.
- Marketing expenses increased year over year as this is a new department being budgeted for FY 23-24 and has no previous year entries.
- BoD Meeting expenses decreased year over year, primarily in a reduction in BoD travel reimbursement as a result of the reduction in reimbursement rates.
- Investments as of March 31, 2024, increased 13.6% as compared to the same period last year. The change resulted in unrealized gains/(losses) due to market activity in the AAPL investment account.
