#### REPRESENTATIVE MATTERS

### • Confidential Arbitration

As first chair, represented a major oil and gas producer in a confidential arbitration against an oilfield services company. Prosecuted multi-million dollar claim for breach of contract and defended against eight-figure counterclaim. After a six-day arbitration hearing and a unanimous decision from the arbitration panel in my client's favor, the case settled with respondent paying my client all its requested damages and interest.

### • NVision Webforce

As co-first chair, represented NVision in a trial against a former partner of the company. Filed claims against former partner for breach of contract and breach of fiduciary duty and defended counterclaims brought by former partner. Delivered opening and closing argument at trial and presented NVision's corporate representative. Secured directed verdict on former partner's counterclaims. Jury awarded NVision full breach of contract damages and damages for breach of fiduciary duty.

#### • TIC CY DT Columbus 12, LLC

As first chair, represented several entities related to a major real estate company in an arbitration against a former investor. Successfully secured dismissal of numerous entities before final hearing. At final hearing, defeated all of claimant's claims against remaining respondents and secured attorneys' fees as prevailing party.

#### • BPX Petroleum

The dispute concerned BPX's rights to drill and produce from valuable depths on one of its leases. Filed, argued, and won motion for summary judgment granting all of BPX's claims and confirming ownership of the mineral rights in dispute.

### • ExxonMobil

As part of a trial team hired after the close of discovery and only three months before trial, won a complete victory in defense of ExxonMobil. Plaintiff had alleged that certain accounting errors and re-allocations by ExxonMobil as an operator in the Conroe Field Unit had caused more than \$4 million dollars of overpayments to other working interest owners. The jury rejected plaintiff's claims and awarded no damages against ExxonMobil.

#### • Carrizo Oil and Gas

As lead counsel, drafted, argued, and won a motion for summary judgment on behalf of Carrizo Oil & Gas Inc., defeating plaintiff's claim related to bonus payment based on 3D seismic data that plaintiff had provided for a portion of the Eagle Ford Shale.
