# JAMES H. MCCUISTION UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS

James began his career in the summer as a student with McCuistion Construction, performing various field tasks like pipe connecting, building roads, and painting facilities in the Beaumont, Texas area. His final summer with the company was spent in a supervisory training role.

He then worked with Sun Oil, primarily focusing on curing title, lease work, and area checks in Southern Louisiana. Over two and a half years at Hunt, James handled a wide range of fieldwork including leasing, pipeline right-of-way acquisitions, damage claim settlements, and real estate checks in Texas, Arkansas, Mississippi, Alabama, North Dakota, South Louisiana, and Montana.

As District Landman at Apexco and Edwin L. Cox, James' duties included negotiating farm-ins, farmouts, joint drilling ventures, supervision of lease acquisitions, selling interest in Apexco and Cox prospects, setting up lease files, responsibility for bank statements of lease account, bottom or dry hole contributions and maintenance of producing properties including liaison with attorneys and consulting geologist on unitization work. Most of his work was concentrated in South Louisiana and in Mississippi, Alabama and Florida, although some work was done on the Texas Gulf Coast. He later worked as an independent lease broker in Lafayette, brokering farm-outs from major companies.


At Houston Oil and Minerals, James was established the land department from scratch, ultimately building a Land Department consisting of approximately 25 people when he resigned.

James then formed Colorado Crude Company in Houston, working primarily on the Gulf Coast of Texas and Louisiana between Corpus Christi and New Orleans. James was President and Chief Operating Officer, which entitled total responsibility for all company operations. James did lease brokerage work, occasional well promotion and production brokerage. James still represents some mineral owners on their acreage in Mississippi.

Finally, James spent two years as Vice President of Land for Gulf Energy Exploration in Austin, Texas, before retiring from the company.




