Leo grew up in Norman, OK in a loving family where as a young man he learned the important life lessons of working hard and playing well with others. In school he showed great potential academically and excelled in athletics. After a stellar high school football career, he joined the nationally ranked University of Oklahoma Sooner football team as a walk-on offensive lineman. It was during this period that he began to develop exceptional risk-reward judgement skills. After a season on the scout team blocking against several All-American and future NFL defensive linemen, he made the fateful and wise decision to focus on the pursuit of his Petroleum Land Management degree.
